








### INTRODUCTION



#### Welcome Family Child Care Providers!

During this challenging time of the COVID-19 pandemic, it has been difficult for many families to maintain connections with their child's early learning program. This challenge has been especially true for families who need to keep their child home for health and safety concerns, and who may have limited access to technology. The Connecticut Office of Early Childhood (OEC) is able to provide technology support to families with young children who are in need and deserving of support. It has also helped to support providers with tech support to keep educating and connecting with these families.

These funds come from \$3 billion Congress set aside for the Education Stabilization Fund through the CARES Act. Connecticut received \$27.8 million, of which the Office of the Governor awarded OEC \$4 million.

The OEC is fortunate to have support from the community with this effort. OEC is partnering with the Regional Educational Service Centers Alliance (RESC), New England Assistive Technology (NEAT), and All Our Kin (AOK) to help distribute Hotspots and other tech devices, as well as provide technical support and learning for children and families.



# **GETTING STARTED**







- You will receive a Kajeet Hotspot and charger.
  - The Kajeet SmartSpot® is a portable Wi-Fi Hotspot that provides children, parents, and educators with the fastest, filtered broadband access anywhere there is cellular coverage.
- All set up instructions can be found on this website or in this video.
- Connecting a device to the Hotspot can be found on this website.
- Any other questions can be answered on the **Kajeet FAQ page**, at the top of the page under Smartspot Guide for Students & Parents.
- This Hotspot is supervised and managed by All Our Kin.
- Devices may not be available to replace a broken, lost, or stolen Hotspot.
- If needing technical support, you can call the Help Desk at 860-407-6789 between 9am and 4pm for assistance.


### **Hotspot Care**

- The devices are filtered with Kajeet Education Broadband™.


  These cloud-based filters provide your child with safe, education-only Internet access.
  - 📫 Always supervise children while they browse the Internet.
  - Always keep your passwords secure.
  - Only allow family members to use the Hotspot.
  - Only communicate online with people you can identify.
  - Never open attachments without trusting the sender.
  - Always remain careful about sharing your personal information. Learn how to recognize and protect yourself from phishing (the tricks that are used to steal information and more) here.



#### **How to Get Started with Sparkler:**

- 1. **Download Sparkler** from the <u>Google Play Store</u> or the <u>Apple App Store</u>. Scan this QR Code with your mobile device to go straight to the right place for downloading.
- 2. Open app and tap Create a New Account.





3. Enter **Your Sparkler Access Code** (formerly "provider key") to connect with your program/provider.

- 4. **Set Up** (enter your email, password)
- 5. **Create Your Account** (your name is required; your address, ZIP, and mobile are optional)
- 6. **Add a Child** (name, pronoun, birthday, prematurity if under 2 are required; photo optional). Your program will be displayed on this screen. If you don't see it, you might not have entered your code in Step 1; enter it here under Cohort/Provider Key.

# How to Use sparkler With Your Child



- Screening: Tap ASQ (Ages & Stages Questionnaires®) to answer questions about your child's development. Explore what your child knows and can do.
- **Submit and Get Results:** Get results, and support if you need it, from 211 Child Development (CDI). Celebrate the milestones your child achieves!



- **Play to Learn:** Young children learn through play with YOU! Sparkler has a 1,000+ playful, standards-based activities to help you and your child learn together.
- Develop Skills: Build heart, mind, body, and words.



- Track Accomplishments: Keep track what you and your child read, learn, and play in Grow, Sparkler's scrapbook.
- **Share:** Share with other caregivers (like a babysitter or grandparent) to keep track of progress together.



- Coaching: Get tips and advice from people at your school/program and experts in early childhood development.
- Q&A: Sparkler offers two-way communication that links parents and the systems that support them.
